# Your Responsibilities

The Director of Research and Evaluation will report to the Vice President of Policy and Research and lead Gakino'amaage: Teach For Canada's efforts in education research projects with First Nations, as well an extensive survey portfolio. Specific responsibilities include:

- Manage departmental strategy to reach ambitious outcomes; this includes leading annual and quarterly reviews and planning of departmental objectives; reviewing and evolving departmental practices and policies using data and researched best practices; as well as developing and tracking the department's budget.
- Lead community-based research projects with community partners by implementing Gakino'amaage: Teach For Canada's Research and Evaluation Framework.
- Design and implement a research training program for youth and community members: participants develop skills related to defining a project, collecting and analyzing data, and report writing.
- Develop impact reports based on research projects and validate findings with First Nations community partners.
- Oversee the survey portfolio through the administration of 10+ surveys across the organization.
- Lead Indigenous data sovereignty at Gakino'amaage: Teach For Canada through the development and maintenance of a data portal, including oversight of the creation of data sharebacks for both internal and external audiences.
- Support the development of organizational logic models as applicable.
- Manage and coach Impact and Learning Manager and Coordinators to support and advance the goals of the department and the organization.
- Work with the Vice President of Policy and Research to develop new Impact and Learning strategies to support organizational objectives and First Nations partners' goals for education and evaluation needs.
- Collaborate with other departments to maximize Gakino'amaage: Teach For Canada's collective impact and ensure policies and practices are aligned.
- Perform other job-related duties as needed.
